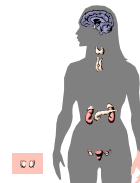
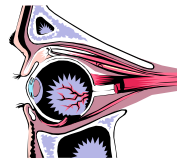

1. INTRODUCTION

Namibia, as many other countries, is striving towards the implementation of the global strategies for health for all. One of the factors influencing the implementation of this strategy is the availability of resources namely; material, financial and human. The public health sector as well as private sector needs resources, in particular human resources composed of the various health professionals, to contribute towards the provision of effective and efficient health services.

In order for the health and social welfare sector to provide effective and efficient health and social welfare services, it needs human resources that have multifaceted skills, such as clinical, technical, social, economical and managerial.

2. PURPOSE OF THIS BOOKLET

The purpose of this booklet is to share information regarding the following:

- Overall aim of the Ministry of Health and Social Services;
- Various career opportunities within the health and welfare sector;
- Entry requirements to medical/health and social welfare related training programmes;
- Short descriptions for various careers;
- Addresses of academic institutions in Namibia and South Africa that offer training as preparations for candidates for their future career in medical and health related field;
- Government Students Financial Assistance Scheme

3. OVERALL AIM OF THE MOHSS

- 3.1 **The ultimate goal of the MOHSS is the attainment of health and social well being of all Namibians, which will enable them to lead on economically and socially productive life.** This is stipulated in the Ministry's policy framework of 1998 that is entitled "**Towards achieving health and social well being for all Namibians.**"
- 3.2 This goal is to be achieved through the implementation of a cost effective Primary Health Care (PHC) approach which will include the improvement of nutrition, safe water supply, basic housing and sanitation, maternal and child care, immunisation, prevention of epidemics, health education and basic curative services.



3.3 Various strategies are also developed to serve as mechanisms for implementing the Ministry's policy to achieve its goal. One of the strategies is human resource development. Through human resource development the Ministry will ensure that the health and social welfare sector is equipped with:

- the right number of people
- in the right place
- at the right time
- with the right skills
- with the right motivation and attitudes
- at the right cost
- doing the right work.

3.4 In the light of the above, this booklet now presents various career opportunities within the health and social welfare sector in the next section. Some of these career opportunities are medical/health and social welfare related while some are not.

4. VARIOUS CAREERS OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN THE HEALTH SECTOR

4.1 Medical/health and social welfare related career opportunities

These are career opportunities for professional categories trained in medical/health and social welfare related fields. Types of these careers are listed in **Table 1**. Brief descriptions of training programmes, entry requirements to these training programmes as well as job opportunities are also included in this table.

4.2 Non-medical/non-health and social welfare related career opportunities

As mentioned in the introduction part, the health sector needs human resources with multifaceted skills. Professionals from other fields are therefore, needed to take up career opportunities within the health and Social Welfare sector. Some of these career opportunities are listed in **Table 2**.

5. ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

For candidates who wish to undertake medical and health related training programmes, this booklet also introduces some academic institutions as listed in Appendix 1 and 2. These are academic institutions in Namibia and South Africa that offer training as preparations for candidates to take up medical and social welfare related career opportunities.



However, in order for students to undertake various training programmes at these institutions, they will need to have financial resources in order to cover the costs involved.

6. STUDENTS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SCHEME (SFAS)

The Government of the Republic of Namibia established a Students Financial Assistance Scheme (SFAS), which is attached to the Ministry of Higher Education, Training and Employment Creation. The Ministry of Higher Education, Training and Employment Creation is hence the only Ministry, which administers the aforementioned scheme. This scheme is established to provide the Government study loans to students undertaking undergraduate training programmes in various fields.

Students that wish to undertake undergraduate study programmes in medical/health and social welfare related fields have therefore to apply for Government study loans from this scheme.

Application forms for study loans are also to be obtained from the abovementioned Ministry (MHETEC) and completed application forms to be submitted back accompanied by the following:





- Identification document/Birth Certificate
- Copies of academic qualifications/transcript
- Information on parental income
- Acceptance letter or any correspondence from the academic institution where the student intends to study

NB: All applications for study loans should reach the MHETEC well in advance before the **closing date**, which is the **31st October** prior to the planned academic year.




Study bursaries can also be obtained from private companies, NGO's and banks.



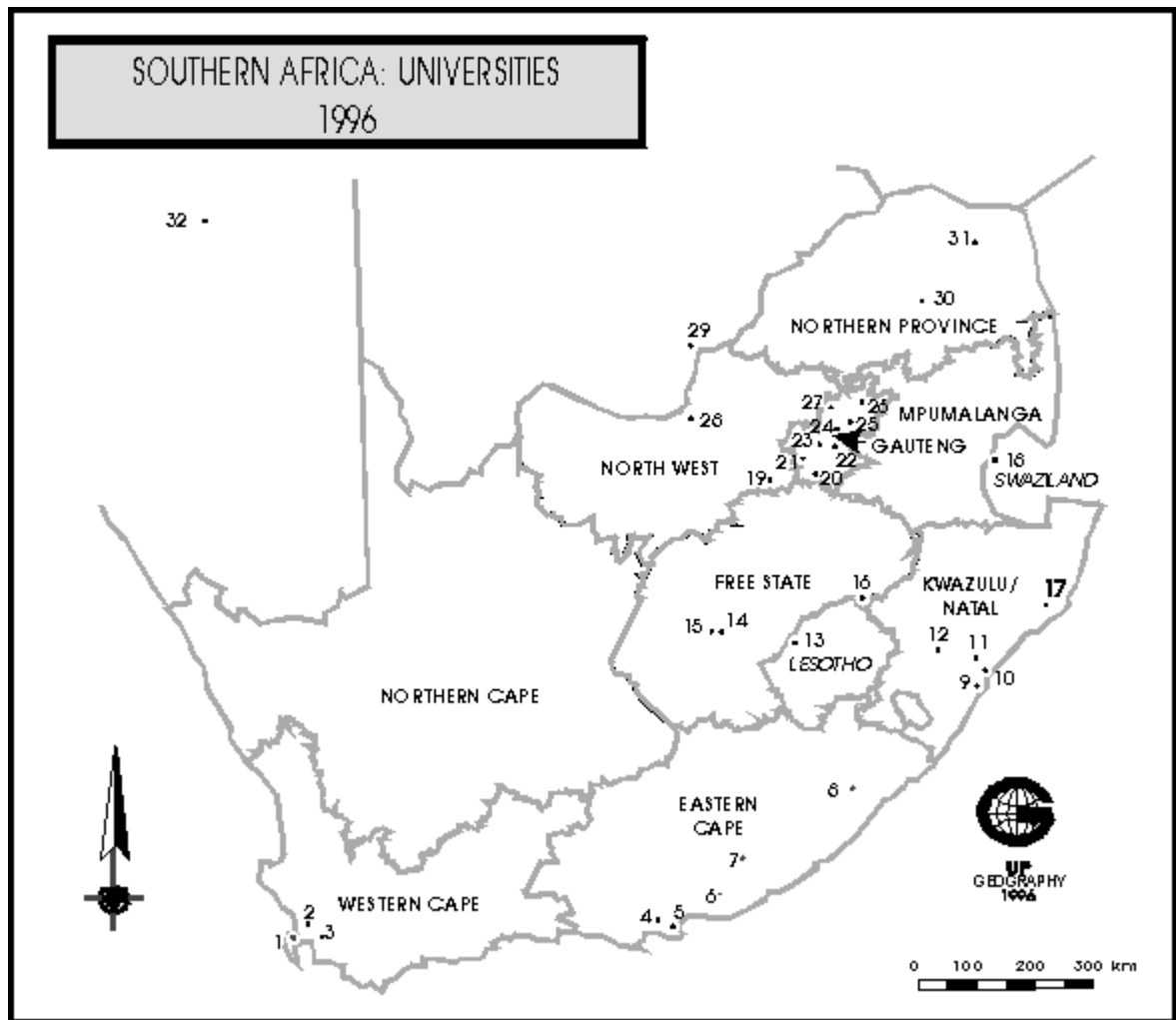
